Context



Luke 15 contains parables about things that are lost, sheep, coins, and a son. Here the rich man is lost. Lazarus is not to be identified with the Lazarus of John 11: 1-44. Those involved in the story are familiar with the teachings of the Law and the Prophets. What do they proclaim to and for God's people?

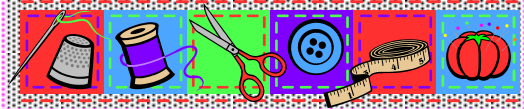
Did the rich man not see the poor man at the gate? Do we overlook people who are different from us?
